



## Low Vision: Impact to Day-to-Day Activities and Interventions

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This course is designed to identify impairments related to a low-vision diagnosis. It provides discussion on how low vision will impact an older person's ability to function independently and safely. It also covers interventions, strategies and planning, including the use of assistive devices, modification in the home setting and use of assistive technology.

- Identify medical conditions that can cause low vision in older adults
- Assess visual function and identify physical and functional limitations resulting from vision loss
- Design intervention strategies for the person with low vision to use their remaining vision in activities of daily living
- Identify adaptive low-vision aids, assistive technology and environmental modifications to maximize the use of remaining vision
